## Consideration of the UPR report of Sierra Leone

Mr President.

Save the Children is delivering this statement with Defence for Children International, on behalf of the Child Rights Coalition of Sierra Leone.<sup>1</sup>

We welcome the report of the Working Group on the UPR of Sierra Leone, in particular the recommendations relating to children's rights.

We welcome the Government's efforts to continuously improve the protection of children's rights through improved legislation, policies and national strategies.

In particular, we welcome the establishment of the National Children's Commission, which has actively taken up its role in monitoring, advocacy and research with respect to the situation of children's rights in Sierra Leone.

We would like to strongly encourage the implementation of the UPR recommendations regarding:

- Ratification of the Optional Protocol to the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women<sup>2</sup>
- Ending discrimination against women and girls in law and in practice,3 including in schools4
- Ending sexual and gender based violence<sup>5</sup>
- Ending child marriage, female genital mutilation, corporal punishment, and other traditional practices that are harmful for children<sup>6</sup>
- Elimination of child labour<sup>7</sup>

- Strengthening of the public health care delivery system, including quality services for women, children and vulnerable groups<sup>8</sup>
- Ensuring effective implementation of the Child Rights Act and other legalisation affecting children (Sexual Offences Act, Domestic Violence Act), including the allocation of sufficient resources to their implementation<sup>9</sup>

Moreover, Ministries and multi-sector responses aimed at addressing violations against children, including gender-based violence, child sexual abuse, FGM and early marriage, should have sufficient technical, human and financial resources to carry out their responsibilities towards children, particularly the most vulnerable.

We appreciate the Government's willingness to consult with civil society in the UPR process and we look forward to continued collaboration in the follow-up.
